Reception

This week our Topic has been dinosaurs! We have been writing fact files about our favourite dinosaurs. We went on an egg hunt and found a giant dinosaur egg, so we have been predicting what sort of dinosaur will hatch from the egg. We have been reading Dinosaurs Love Underpants, and we have been painting pictures of underpants that the dinosaurs would love! We have been measuring dinosaurs using bricks, and recording how long and tall the dinosaurs are. We have been ordering dinosaur foot prints and we have been talking about the jobs of palaeontologists. We have been reading lots of fiction and non-fiction books about dinosaurs.

Year One

In Maths this week we have been finding half of a number, half of a picture and half of a shape. In English this week we have been recapping the story of The Great Fire of London. We acted out scenes from the story and we have been thinking about the characters feelings. We have also been writing questions to people that lived in 1666, and used those questions for hot seating. In Science this week we conducted an experiment to find out which material would be best to make buckets out of! In Geography this week we learnt about the Great Fire of London monument, and we coloured in parts of London on a map that were affected by the fire. In Art this week we have been designing our own houses and talking about which materials we would build our houses with. In PE this week we have been using the apparatus.

Year Two

This week in maths we have been learning about time, looking at O'Clock, quarter past, half past and quarter to, and we have been counting round the clock in fives. In English this week we have been learning about Oliver Jeffers and writing our own versions of the story Lost and Found. In PE this week we have been learning to play tennis, and we have been practicing the ready position. We have looked at a timeline of authors from Beatrix Potter to Oliver Jeffers.
